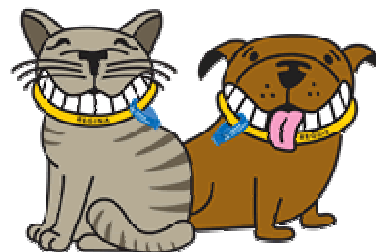


# Registration fees



## Dogs

Yearly registration fees for dogs valid from 1 July 2009.

Registration type	Full fee	Pensioner fees
Entire dog	\$87.50 (GST exempt)	\$43.75 (GST exempt)
Desexed dog	\$37 (GST exempt)	\$14 (GST exempt)
Guide, hearing and assistance dogs	No fee	No fee

Yearly registration fees for regulated dogs valid from 1 July 2009.

Registration type	Full fee	Reduced fee*
Dangerous dog	\$420 (GST exempt)	\$126 (GST exempt)
Menacing dog	\$420 (GST exempt)	\$126 (GST exempt)

\* granted in subsequent years upon successful performance review and continuing compliance with the conditions set

## Cats

Please note: until 30 June 2010, Council is offering an amnesty for desexed cats and owners intending to desex their cat within this period. This means no payment is required to be submitted with your registration application.

Yearly registration fees for cats valid from 1 July 2009.

Registration type	Full fee	Pensioner fees
Entire cat	\$40 (GST exempt)	\$20 (GST exempt)
Desexed cat	Amnesty available until June 2010. Fee is normally \$20 (GST exempt)	Amnesty available until June 2010. Fee is normally \$10 (GST exempt)

**Failure to register your cat or dog annually from three months of age may result in a \$200 fine.**

## Breeder/show/association concession

Concessions for breeders, show permits and associations.



Criteria	Full fee	Pensioner fees
Canine Control Council Qld	\$37 (GST exempt)	\$14 (GST exempt)
Greyhound Racing Control Board Authority Qld (for Greyhounds only)	\$37 (GST exempt)	\$14 (GST exempt)
Animal breeder/show permit - dog	\$37 (GST exempt)	\$14 (GST exempt)
Animal breeder/show permit - cat	\$20 (GST exempt)	\$10 (GST exempt)

## Cat or dog registration concessions

You will receive a concession if:

- the cat or dog is desexed
- you hold a current Centrelink Pensioner concession card
- you hold a Veterans' Affairs Repatriation Health card - for all conditions (Gold Card)
- you are a current member of either the Canine Control Council of Queensland or the Greyhound Racing Control Board of Queensland
- you hold a current Brisbane City Council Animal Breeder/Show permit

## Desexed pets

If your cat or dog is desexed you will need to specify this on the animal registration application to receive the concessional rate. You will need to specify details of the vet who undertook the procedure and the date the procedure took place.

If you intend desexing your pet in the first year of registration, but it is too young to undergo the procedure at the time of registration, the desexed rate will be charged. This should be specified on the animal registration application. Should the animal not be desexed by the time the second year of registration is due, the full registration rate will be charged.

No additional concession is offered for cats or dogs that are microchipped.

## Fee amnesty

**There is no fee for registering desexed cats between 1 July 2009 to 30 June 2010.** This also applies to owners who intend to have their cat desexed within this period. You will still need to submit a registration form.
