Priority Infrastructure for West End, South Brisbane and Highgate Hill

Council approved the Priority Infrastructure Policy (PIP) for Brisbane at the Council meeting on 25th May 2010. The PIP identified major infrastructure projects that shall be funded from contributions from development approval.

West End projects include:

Community Centre at Victoria Street

Upgrade to West End Ferry terminal

Acquisition land at Davies Park

\$2.6 million

Upgrade to Davies Park

\$6.4 million

Upgrade to Orleigh Park

\$1.58 million

Upgrade to West End Riverside Park

"Urban Common" corner of Vulture Street and Thomas Street

Small space Beesley Street
 Small space Rogers Street
 “New park” near Montague Road between Victoria and Grey Streets
 Upgrade of Boundary Street River ‘stub’ park
 Upgrade of Carlow Street River ‘stub’ park

South Brisbane projects include:

An indoor sport facility
 A Community Arts Centre in the Heritage Building adjacent Hale Street Toll Bridge
 Upgrade to SouthBank 1 & 2 Ferry terminal
 Upgrade to River Plaza Ferry terminal
 New park on Parmalat site \$22 million
 Upgrade South Brisbane Riverside Park \$2.9 million

Highgate Hill

Four Link Parks at Derby Street, Sankey Street, Dauphin Street including adjacent road space and link between Fraser Street to St James Street.

This is an important list. However the funds raised from development approvals in West End and South Brisbane **will be well below the real cost to the community.**

The projected population growth in West End and South Brisbane used for the Priority Infrastructure Policy **is 3,300 dwellings or 5,940 residents**. These figures are the basis for the amount of the infrastructure contributions from development in these suburbs. Similarly the projected increase in workers in the area **is a mere 3,591**. These figures are Councils basis of the calculations for the next 5 years of development.

However the South Brisbane Riverside Neighbourhood Plan calculates an increase of 25,500 residents and approximately 33,000 workers.

The basis of the charges is seriously incorrect!!

Traffic Lights

Parents of West End State School and I were determined to have funds allocated for traffic lights in Council’s 2010-11 Budget. These traffic lights have been in my top ten projects for funding for two years. I have addressed Council on this issue, submitted a petition and supported local residents.

Mrs Linda Hogendoorn addressed Council on Tuesday 25th May 2010. Her description of the children lined up along the footpath so they can all cross in the same break in the traffic certainly got the safety message across to this administration.

There is \$500,000 in the budget for the traffic lights. Passengers of CityGlider, weekend shoppers going to the West End Markets and the pupils of West End State School will all benefit.

Daylight Saving feedback

I would like to thank the 181 people who took the time to complete the survey on Daylight Saving for South-East Queensland.

I am now able to provide you with the results.

99 people **(54%) thought there should be a referendum on Daylight Saving** in South-East Queensland.

122 people or **67% wanted a trial of daylight saving**.

There were 23 people who did not support either as they said "just do it"
Therefore 80 % support daylight saving for South East Queensland.

I have forwarded your responses with individual comments to the Hon. Anna Bligh, MP, South Brisbane but without giving your name, address or email.

Sunday 6 June 2010 - 10am to 4pm at West End State School, 24 Vulture St, West End. Enter via Jane or Horan Streets.

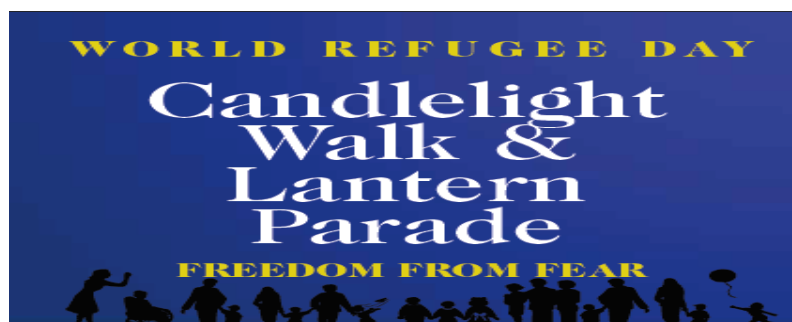
The West End State School Fiesta is an annual event and the school's major fundraiser for the year.

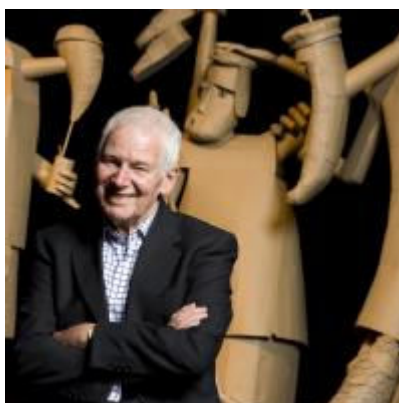
